

Our Vision:






Cheam Fishing Village

Maximum Loan of \$150,000 for Indigenous entrepreneurs with new or existing businesses in Sólh Téméxw.



With up to a five-year term for both opportunities for borrowing. **Entrepreneurs with Disabilities**






Over 330 Indigenous Owned Businesses!



Indigenous Women in Business


- 27% of the 330 businesses are owned by Indigenous women who own 100% of their business.
- 7% of the 330 business have some form of ownership by Indigenous women and partnerships










Application Process
